

# Roy Days Parade Rules 2022


**Date:** August 6<sup>th</sup>

**Check-in/Line-up:** 7:30am

**Parade Judging:** 8:00am -8:30am

**Parade Start Time:** 9:00 am –

**Note:** 1900 W. CLOSED AT 8:30am



1. Parade Route
  - a. The parade will be conducted using 5 operating lanes. The lanes are designated using the existing traffic lines. See the map above.
  - b. Parade route will be on 1900 w. The parade will start at 5150 S. & conclude at 4200 S.
  - c. Entries will exit the parade route at 4150 S. into the America First parking lot. Single vehicle entries may exit the parade route onto 4000 S.
  - d. Entries shall not stop to unload or park until they have at least reached the west parking lot of America First. No riders should be unloaded in the east parking lots.
  - e. Alternate pick-up zones- Roy Library, George Whalen North Park, North Park Elementary. Please coordinate this with your riders' parents to avoid congestion at the parade exit point.
2. Parade LANE assignments
  - a. LANE 1- EAST – Walkers/Performers- candy/giveaway allowed
  - b. LANE 2- EAST – Safety Zone- Police and Parade staff only
  - c. LANE 3- CENTER- Motorized vehicles only- No candy/giveaways/walkers allowed
  - d. LANE 4- WEST- Safety Zone- Police and Parade staff only
  - e. LANE 5- WEST- Walkers/Performers – candy/giveaway allowed
3. Motorized Vehicles- LANE 3
  - a. All motorized vehicles must drive down the median (turn lane) LANE 3
  - b. Motorized vehicles are not permitted to serpentine. They need to stay within the traffic lines of LANE 3.
  - c. Entries shall maintain 1 - 2 car lengths between their entry and the entry in front of them. Operating at a slow pace. Do not pass the walkers from the entry in front of you.
  - d. Riders on vehicles, trailers, or floats must always remain seated. We recommend for smaller children be accompanied by an adult.
  - e. No riders are allowed to sit on open tailgates or off the side of the trailer.
  - f. Riders are not allowed to jump on and off their entry.
  - g. Riders/Drivers are not allowed to throw any items such as candy, promotional items, etc. Those items may be distributed by walkers in LANE 1 or LANE 5 or Both
  - h. Semi-Trailers will be permitted to have spotters on their axles.

4. Walkers/Performers- LANE 1(East) and LANE 5 (West)
  - a. Walker/Performers will be allowed in LANE 1 and LANE 5.
    - i. Entries such as dance groups, cheer, and sports teams with large amounts of walkers may choose to walk in LANE 1 OR LANE 5 or they may split up their group and walk in both LANE 1 and LANE 5. Walkers are not permitted to switch between lanes or crossover the safety lane to access their entries motorized vehicle/trailer.
    - ii. If the entry has a Motorized vehicle/trailer, it will operate in LANE 3 parallel to the entry's walkers in LANE 1 and/or LANE 5.
  - b. If an entry wants to throw candy/promotional items, they will be allowed to in LANE 1 and LANE 5 only by means of their entry's "walkers"
  - c. Walkers may not return to their vehicle/trailer to acquire additional candy/promotional items. Walkers must use a backpack, wagon, or any sort of bag to carry all their items. Suggest having parents stationed along the parade route with candy to refill the walkers.
  - d. No motorized vehicles will be allowed in LANE 1, LANE 2, LANE 4, OR LANE 5. This includes 4-wheelers, side-by-sides, golf carts, etc.
  - e. We encourage children under the age of 6 to ride on their entry with an adult instead of walking
5. Safety Lanes- LANE 2 & LANE 4
  - a. The safety lanes are used to provide a buffer between the walkers and the motorized vehicles to help ensure the safety of all participants in the parade as well as spectators.
  - b. Police/Fire personnel and Parade staff will monitor the safety lanes to assure entries are not throwing candy from the motorized vehicles/trailers, riders are not exiting their entry, and walkers are not crossing through the safety lane to their motorized vehicle/trailer.
  - c. Only parade staff and police/fire personnel are allowed in the safety lanes.
6. Staging Instructions-
  - a. Every entry is assigned a parade lineup number (See Attached "Parade Line-up 2022)
  - b. Your lineup number will determine your staging area.

**Staging Area 1- Entry Numbers 1-31 - Check In @ - Elks Lodge- 5200 S. 1900 W.**

**NOTE:** 1900 W. will be closed at 8:30 am. Entries must be to Elks Lodge prior to 8:30.

**Staging Area 2- Entry Numbers 32-80 - Check In @ - 4800 S. 1750 W (Airport Road)**

**NOTE:** You can only access 1750 w. (Airport Road) from 4400 South. Do not try & access from 4800 S or Riverdale Road. You will be stopped by PD and redirected to go to 4400 s.

- c. Entry numbers will be provided at your staging area check-in table. Please display your numbers on both sides of your entry so our parade committee and parade announcers can clearly see your number. We will provide tape that is safe for your vehicle.
- d. The entry numbers are painted on the ground of the parade staging road. Entries will park in the correlating spot which was based on the size you requested in your application. Please make sure you are lining up in your assigned staging spot.
- e. We recommend for entries with children to coordinate a meet-up location outside of the staging road (1750 W.) The fewer vehicles we have on the parade staging road (1750 w.) the safer we are. The west parking lot at America First, Roy Library, or North Park Elementary are great meet-up locations.

It is the responsibility of the parade entry applicant to make sure your entry and all who participate with your entry follow the rules. Any entries that do not comply with these rules are subject to not being allowed in the parade in the future. Safety needs should be everyone's number one priority.
